


Supporting HBC on BBO

Q: How do I find one of the on-line games that supports the Hartford Bridge Club?

The ACBL and BBO have teamed up to offer a new series called **Support Your Club**. These events are more expensive: daylong games are \$6 and regular games are \$5, but 80% of the entry fee gets sent back to your home club (i.e. HBC). These are also the only events on BBO which offer Black points (i.e. the same color you get from a game at the club). To find these games, you'll want to click on the **ACBL World** item from the homepage. That'll take you to a list of all the ACBL games that are currently open for registration, like this:

The ones with **ACBLSYC** in the left column are the ones that award Black points and give back to the HBC. The one I highlighted is a daylong event for Individual players (see the third column). That means, you will be playing at a table with 3 robots. The Pairs events of this type start at 10, 5 and 7:30 every day and are open two hours before game time. Try and get there a little early as these games have a limit, so they can and do fill up. The events are stratified, so it'll be like playing in one of the day games at HBC.
