# Cue Bidding

A cue bid is a **forcing bid** in a suit the bidder doesn't actually want to play in. There are two common types of cue bids: conventional bids and control bids.

### Conventional Cue Bids

The most common conventional cue bids are:

- Limit raise or better: a bid of an opponent's suit made after partner has bid a suit. For example, in the auction 1♠ 2♥ 3♥, 3♥ shows a limit raise or better in spades. (Remember from last week's lesson on jump raises, a bid of 3♠ after RHO's 2♥ bid, would be weak.)
- Western cue bid: a bid of an opponent's suit asking partner to bid NT with a stopper in that suit. For example, in the auction, 1 → -1 ▼ 1 → Pass 3 → Pass 3 ▼, 3 ▼ asks partner to bid 3NT with a heart stopper. (This bid usually shows support for one of opener's minors.)
- Michael's Cue Bid: a bid of opponent's suit showing a two-suited hand (usually at least 5-5). For example, in the auction 1♣ 2♣, 2♣ shows both majors; 1♣ 2♠, 2♠ shows both majors; in the auction 1♥ 2♥, 2♥ shows spades and a minor; in the auction 1♠ 2♠, 2♠ shows hearts and a minor.
- Splinter: a double jump in an unbid suit showing shortness in that suit. For
  example, in the auction 1♠ Pass 4◆, 4◆ shows spade support and a singleton
  or void in diamonds.

#### Control Cue Bids

Control cue bids are used when a partnership has agreed on a trump suit and is looking for slam. Control bids are more useful than Ace-asking bids (such as Blackwood or Roman Key Card) in situations in which the slam seeker has either a void or a side suit that's off two quick tricks and wants to know which Aces and/or Kings partner has, not just how many.

A control bid shows an Ace or King (or in a suit contract, a void or a singleton) that will prevent the opponents from taking the first 2 tricks in that suit. Typically, the first-bid suit shows first-round control in a suit and the second-bid suit shows second-round control in a suit (although both bids can show first-round control).

When making a cue bid, you bid your **lowest possible** Ace first (not necessarily your lowest Ace), and then you cue-bid any other Aces before you start cue-bidding Kings. For example, if the previous bid was  $4 \bullet$  and you have the A, the A, and the A, you cue-bid the A first (the **lowest possible** Ace), and then the A, and then (in the unlikely event you're still cue-bidding) the A. But if the previous bid was A, and you have the A, the A, and the A, you cue-bid the A first and then the A, and then the A.

So, in the auction  $1 \leftarrow Pass - 1 \leftarrow Pass - 3 \leftarrow Pass - 4 \leftarrow Pass - 5 \leftarrow Pass - 5 \leftarrow A \leftarrow Shows \ A; 5 \ Shows the \ A; and 5 \ Shows the \ K. (With both the \ A and the \ A, you would have cue bid the \ A first.)$ 

How do I know if I should cue bid - or if my partner is cue-bidding?

- Control cue bids are used only after you've established a fit (a suit has been bid and raised).
- You must be in a game-forcing auction. So, in the auction 1 → Pass 2 → Pass 3 → does not show a control.
- Slam must be a serious possibility.
- Bidding must be at the 4-level or above. So, in the auction 1♥ Pass 3♥ Pass 4♣, 4♣ shows a control.

#### More to know:

- Cue bids are NOT alertable.
- Cue bids are absolutely forcing.
- Don't cue-bid the A or K of trump.
